Andre Agassi Winner of eight Grand Slam tennis singles titles; the only tennis player to win each of the four Grand Slam singles titles, the Masters, the Davis Cup, and an Olympic gold medal.

Madeleine Albright First female secretary of state of the United States.

Alan Alda Actor who also writes and directs feature films; played Hawkeye on the popular television series *M*A*S*H*.

Woody Allen Academy Award winning film director, writer, actor, and comedian.

Lance Armstrong Seven-time winner of the Tour de France and well-known cancer survivor.

Fantasia Barrino Popular singer; 2004 winner of the *American Idol* talent competition.

Jeffrey Bezos Founder and CEO of the Internet company Amazon.com.

Richard Branson British entrepreneur who has founded a series of companies that sell everything from cola, books, and music to mobile phone service.

Sergey Brin Co-founder of the Internet company Google, Inc.

Zbigniew Brzezinski National security advisor to President Jimmy Carter.

Warren Buffett Berkshire Hathaway chairman and CEO whose ability to spot undervalued companies and purchase them cheaply has made him and the people whose money he invests extremely wealthy; in five decades he has amassed a fortune of over \$42 billion, most of which he has committed to pass on to philanthropic organizations.

Susan Butcher Four-time winner of the Iditarod, the 1,150 mile dog sled race across Alaska.

Dr. Ben Carson Celebrated pediatric neurosurgeon who is director of pediatric neurosurgery at Johns Hopkins; in 1987 made medical history by being the first surgeon to successfully separate conjoined twins joined at the head.

Johnny Cash Grammy winning country singer and songwriter who sold over 50 million albums and received multiple country music awards.

Bill Clinton Former President of the United States.

Hillary Clinton Senator from New York and former First Lady.

Sasha Cohen United States Figure Skating Ladies Champion in 2005 and silver medalist at the 2006 Winter Olympics.

Deborah Copaken Kogan Photojournalist whose work has appeared in *Time*, *Newsweek*, and *The New York Times*.

Donny Deutsch Chairman and CEO of Deutsch Inc, one of America's top ad agencies; host of the talk show *The Big Idea*.

Corey Dillon Premier running back for the New England Patriots who gained over 1000 yards in 2004; helped the Patriots win Super Bowls XXXVIII and XXXIX.

Michael Eisner Former chairman and CEO of The Walt Disney Company.

Larry Ellison Founder, chairman, and CEO of Oracle, one of the world's largest developers of computer-based management information systems.

Roger Federer Winner of nine Grand Slam tennis singles titles.

Richard Feynman A Nobel Prize winning physicist who during WWII worked on the Manhattan Project to build the atomic bomb.

Carly Fiorina Former CEO of Hewlett Packard.

Bill Gallagher Co-founder of A D S Financial Services Solutions, a major provider of technological and consulting services to financial institutions.

Bill Gates Co-founder and chairman of the computer software giant Microsoft.

J. Paul Getty Founder of Getty Oil Company and one of the world's first billionaires.

Katharine Graham Former CEO, chairman, and publisher of *The Washington Post*; one of the most powerful women in America during the period she headed the Post.

John Grisham Only American writer to author a number-one bestselling novel of the year for seven years in a row (1994–2000); has sold more than 60 million copies of his books.

Justine Henin-Hardenne Winner of five Grand Slam tennis singles titles.

Billie Holiday American singer who is considered one of the greatest female jazz voices of all time.

Bill Hewlett Co-founder of the Hewlett-Packard Company, a leading producer of computers and peripherals.

Lee Iacocca Former president of Ford Motors and CEO of Chrysler; saved Chrysler from certain bankruptcy and rebuilt it into a viable company.

Phil Jackson A National Basketball Association (NBA) coach who has won nine NBA championships.

Michael Jordan Former professional basketball player who led the Chicago Bulls to six NBA championships.

Wynonna Judd A Grammy award winning country music singer who has had over 20 number one singles.

Jeong Kim Founder of the telecommunications company Yurie Systems, which he sold in 1998 to Lucent Technologies for over \$1 billion.

Larry King Host of the nightly interview program, *Larry King Live*, which is one of television's longest running shows.

George Lucas One of America's most successful independent directors and film makers who is best known for his movies *American Graffiti*, *Star Wars*, and the *Indiana Jones* series.

Peter Meyers Mediator and labor lawyer; inducted into the prestigious College of Labor and Employment Lawyers in 2005.

Andrea Mitchell American journalist, television commentator, and writer; covers international issues for all NBC News broadcasts including *NBC Nightly News* and *Today*.

Charles Ogletree Harvard Law School Jesse Climenko Professor of Law and founding and executive director of the Charles Hamilton Houston Institute for Race and Justice; in 2006 named by *Ebony* magazine as one of the 100+ Most Influential Black Americans.

Dave Packard Co-founder of Hewlett-Packard Company, a leading producer of computers and peripherals.

Larry Page Co-founder of the Internet company Google, Inc.

Ben Richardson Vice chairman and chief of operations at Gant Electronics.

Anita Roddick Founder of the international retail chain The Body Shop.

Bob Schieffer Chief Washington correspondent for CBS who also serves as anchor and moderator of *Face The Nation*, the Sunday public affairs broadcast.

Stan Shih Co-founder and former chairman and CEO of the Acer Group, the Taiwanese computer maker.

Donna Shirley Leader of the team that built the *Sojourner*, the first solar-powered rover to explore the surface of Mars.

Fred Smith Founder, chairman, and CEO of Federal Express.

George Soros Founder of and advisor to the highly profitable Quantum Fund; founder of The Soros Foundations, which works to promote democracy, human rights, and economic and social reform around the world.

Michael Steinhardt One of the most successful money managers in the history of Wall Street.

Martha Stewart Business mogul and media personality who has transformed American homes and gardens.

Margaret Thatcher The United Kingdom's first female prime minister.

Roy Vagelos Former chairman and CEO of Merck who was known for attracting top research scientists and developing new, groundbreaking drugs.

Sam Walton Founder and former chairman and CEO of Wal-Mart.

Jack Welch Former CEO of General Electric.

Oprah Winfrey Host of *The Oprah Winfrey Show*, which is seen by an estimated 49 million viewers each week and is broadcast to 122 countries around the world; founder of Harpo Productions, Inc.; considered by many to be the world's most influential woman and the only African-American billionaire.

John Wooden One of college basketball's greatest coaches, he won 10 NCAA national championships at UCLA; first person admitted to the Basketball Hall of Fame both as a coach and player.

Tiger Woods Winner of 12 major golf championships; expected to eventually surpass Jack Nicklaus's record of 20 major wins.

Bob Woodward The *Washington Post* reporter who helped uncover the Watergate scandal that led to Richard Nixon's resignation; author of twelve best-selling nonfiction books.
